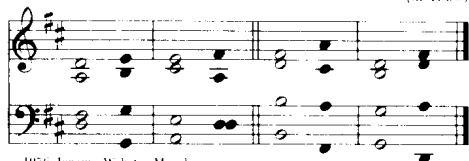

Today's Music

Today's organ prelude and postlude feature baroque music. The prelude is based on the tune "Wie schön leuchtet" (How bright appears the Morning Star - Hymn 496) as set by Johann Pachelbel (c. 1653-1706), a German composer, organist, and teacher who brought the south German organ tradition to its peak. He composed a large body of sacred and secular music, and his contributions to the development of the chorale prelude and fugue have earned him a place among the most important composers of the middle Baroque era. The postlude is the lively Prelude and Fugue in F Major by Dietrich Buxtehude (c.1637-1707), a Danish-German organist and composer. His organ works represent a central part of the standard organ repertoire and are frequently performed at recitals and in church services. He composed in a wide variety of vocal and instrumental idioms, and his style strongly influenced many composers, including Johann Sebastian Bach. Today, Buxtehude is considered one of the most important composers in Germany of the mid-Baroque.

The Cathedral Choir sings a fine piece by Arvo Pärt, "Morning Star". Pärt (b. 1935) is an Estonian composer of classical and religious music. Since the late 1970s, he has worked in a minimalist style that employs his self-invented compositional technique, *tintinnabuli*. Pärt's music is in part inspired by Gregorian chant. Since 2011 Pärt has been the most performed living composer in the world.

Hymn Notes

How firm a foundation - Hymnal 636

The author is listed as "K" in John Rippon's Selection. We know that the precentor at Dr. Rippon's church in London was Richard Keen and we assume that it was he who wrote this text. There are many scriptural references: Isaiah 43:1-5,12; II Timothy 2:10 and Hebrews 13:5. It is basically about the promises of God as indicated by all of the quotation marks. The last line, "I'll never, no, never, no, never forsake" is a triumphant conclusion.
