Today's Music

Today's organ music comes from the great German baroque composer from Leipzig, Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). The prelude is a transcription from Cantata 208 of a vocal solo known in English as "Sheep May Safely Graze" and arranged for organ solo by Houston organist Matthew Dirst. This charming music depicts a rural scene. The postlude is a chorale prelude from the collection known as the Great Eighteen Chorales, "Komm, Gott, Schopfer, heiliger Geist (Come, God, Creator, Holy Ghost)". Because the chords are on the off-beats, the prelude might sound somewhat askew until the chorale melody is presented in the pedal with long values accompanied by sweeping lines for the manuals.

The Cathedral Choir sings a fine setting of George Herbert's famous poem "Come, My Way, My Truth, My Life" as set by John Clements (1910-1986). George Herbert (1593 – 1633) was a Welsh-born poet, orator, and priest of the Church of England. His poetry is associated with the writings of the metaphysical poets, and he is recognised as "one of the foremost British devotional lyricists." He was born into an artistic and wealthy family and largely raised in England. He received a good education that led to his admission to Trinity College, Cambridge in 1609. He went there with the intention of becoming a priest, but he became the University's Public Orator and attracted the attention of King James I. He served in the Parliament of England in 1624 and briefly in 1625. He was eventually ordained and ended life as the rector of the little parish of St Andrew's Church, Lower Bemerton, Salisbury. He was noted for unfailing care for his parishioners. He was never a healthy man and died of consumption at age 39.

Hymn Notes

Of Huguenot ancestry and strict training in Calvinism, Faber moved from priesthood in the Anglican Church to the Roman Catholic Church in 1846. He wrote 150 hymns corresponding to the number of Psalms. This hymn matches the simplicity and evangelical fervor of the Wesleys, Newton and others.
