The Gift of SPACE

This week, we reflect on the importance of space as we pay tribute to the lasting legacy of the OKC Memorial Marathon and events of April 19. We highlight the significance of the Memorial Gates and East Garden, which hold a special place in the history of St. Paul's Episcopal Cathedral.

The Cathedral's history is deeply intertwined with the tragic bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building on April 19, 1995, causing significant damage to the Cathedral itself. Despite the devastation, St. Paul's Episcopal Cathedral quickly transformed into a crucial triage center for rescue workers and a sanctuary for those seeking spiritual comfort during that dark time.

In remembrance of the young lives lost in the Murrah Building tragedy, the children of St. Paul's planted a Weeping Willow in the Cathedral Garden. The Memorial Gates, adorned with 168 circles, each represent one of the individuals who tragically perished. The original Cathedral Cross, which fell and broke on that fateful day, now rests above the Memorial Gates as a poignant symbol of resilience and remembrance.

The history and space of our beloved Cathedral are inseparable from the events of April 19, 1995. May the space we offer at the Cathedral embody the essence of the OKC Memorial Mission: *"To honor the memory of those lost, those who survived, and those changed forever. May this memorial provide solace, strength, peace, hope, and serenity to all who visit."*
