## St. Crispin

St. Crispin and his brother St. Crispinian were said to have been persecuted for preaching Christianity by day while making shoes by night in the Early Church and martyred on 25 October, 285 or 286. Their feast day is October 25<sup>th</sup>. They are the patron saints of cobblers; curriers; glove makers; lace makers; lace workers; leather workers; saddle makers; saddlers; shoemakers; tanners; weavers.
